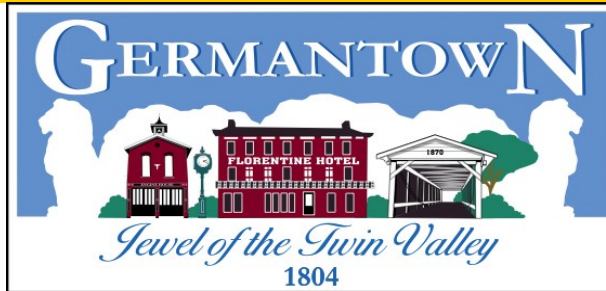

Leaf Collection Has Begun

The Germantown Service Department will be collecting leaves through December 7th. Collection is weather dependent and the collection schedule may be lengthened or shortened based upon it. Please rake your leaves to the edge of your property in an open area where they are accessible to the crews, not behind parked cars, mail boxes, trees, shrubs etc. Leaves will not be picked up on holidays. Residents may also bring leaves to the Service Department, located at 148 S. Water Street, between the hours of 7 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.


Monday-Friday. Please place leaves in the designated area.

Bagged leaves must be emptied and bags taken with you.

Brush is not accepted.
